Col Claudia M. Eid is the Commander, 97th Medical Group at Altus Air Force Base, Oklahoma. She is responsible for providing safe and reliable healthcare to more than 7,200 Department of Defense beneficiaries to include 2,000 KC-46 Pegasus, C-17 Globemaster III, and KC-135 Stratotanker Total Force aircrew students annually with a \$11.8M budget across two squadrons. The 97th Medical Group ensures wartime readiness by promoting the health, safety, and morale of base active duty personnel, and trains medical personnel in support of worldwide contingency operations.

The colonel entered the U.S. Air Force in 1998 as a Bioenvironmental Engineer after receiving a master's degree from the University of Toledo. She has served in a variety of positions at the wing, numbered air force, major command, combatant command, Joint Staff, and secretariat levels.
